



There is a growing urgency for collective and large scale action to protect the biodiversity in and around cities to prevent irreversible loss and damage to the natural systems we depend on.



The Barcelona Metropolitan Area (AMB) spreads 636 km² on the Mediterranean Basin and hosts a population of 3.2 million people from 36 different municipalities. Our area's diverse terrain, with coastal mountain ranges and two fluvial and river mouth systems allow for different habitats and species to concentrate in a reduced geographic area. AMB also counts with more than 30 km of beaches and a network of more than 50 urban and periurban parks.





Coming Soon: **City Biodiversity Index (CBI)**

- Tool for cities to do **baseline measurements** of their current biodiversity profiles and then monitor and assess them over time
- Public platform on which **biodiversity awareness raising** exercises can be launched
- **Shared goals and data collection** across stakeholders encouraging better communication, stronger networks and more co-operation


